**A. Review of New State and Federal Legislation Affecting Women**

The Subcommittee will review bills introduced in the State Legislature and Congress that address the Women's Advisory Board's stated legislative priorities of women's health, violence against women and pay equity.

**Women's Health**

**1. Breast Cancer Patient Protection Act of 2009**

The Breast Cancer Patient Protection Act of 2009 (S.688) amends the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), the Public Health Service Act, and the Internal Revenue Code to require a group health plan that provides medical and surgical benefits to ensure that inpatient (and in the case of a lumpectomy, outpatient) coverage and radiation therapy are provided for breast cancer treatment.<sup>i</sup>

**2. Insurance Coverage for BRCA 1 or BRCA 2 Genetic Marker Testing**

Some healthcare policy advocates are pushing for legislation requiring all insurance companies to provide coverage for BRCA gene testing upon recommendation from a medical professional. BRAC is the breast cancer susceptibility gene.

**Recommendation:** Review and Discussion. Make recommendations for possible action by the WAB as appropriate.
