3. The EMPOWER Act, regarding steps to reduce sexual harassment workplaces.
4. The Equality Act prohibits discrimination on the basis of sexual orientation and gender identity in employment, housing, public accommodations, public education, federal funding, credit, and the jury system.
5. The Paycheck Fairness Act would add procedural protections to the Equal Pay Act of 1963 and the Fair Labor Standards Act as part of an effort to address the gender pay gap in the United States.
6. Women's Health Protection Act protects constitutional right to abortion.
7. Title X Regulation – enforcement of regulations that prohibit Title X grant recipients from counseling patients about abortion.
