SUBJECT: The City Council will discuss goals regarding community safety and well-being and provide direction regarding the development of policies, programs, and funding strategies that are aligned with articulated priorities.

RECOMMENDATIONS: 1) Discuss City's goals & priorities for enhancing community safety and well-being; and 2) Provide direction relating to the Los Angeles County Sheriff Department (LASD), security services, and alternative crisis response and mental health services.

5.B. MEASURES TO INCREASE COMMUNITY SAFETY ON COMMERCIAL STREETS [L. MEISTER, J. LEONARD, A. LOVANO]:

SUBJECT: The City Council will consider directing staff to work with the Public Safety Commission and the business community to develop measures to increase community safety on commercial streets, including but not limited to, developing a commercial public safety camera rebate program and gathering feedback on a Neighborhood Watch model for commercial areas.

RECOMMENDATIONS: 1) Direct staff to work with the Public Safety Commission and the business community to increase community safety on commercial streets, including: a. Develop a commercial public safety camera rebate program to increase the number of cameras on commercial corridors, b. Gather feedback from businesses on a Neighborhood Watch model for commercial areas; and 2) Return to City Council with

recommendations for moving forward with these ideas and other possible options for increasing community safety on commercial streets.
