- **November Meeting Adjustment:** Schedule the November meeting to take place on Thursday, November 5, 2026, due to the Thanksgiving holiday and necessity to move other Subcommittee and Commission meetings.
- **December Meeting Adjustment:** Schedule the December meeting to take place on Thursday, December 3, 2026, due to the end of year holidays and necessity to move other Subcommittee and Commission meetings.

The following adjustments for the Performing and Cultural Arts Subcommittee schedule are as follows:

- **November Meeting Adjustment:** Schedule the November meeting to take place

on Thursday, November 5, 2026, due to the Thanksgiving holiday and necessity to move other Subcommittee and Commission meetings.

- **December Meeting Adjustment:** Schedule the December meeting to take place on Thursday, December 3, 2026, due to the end of year holidays and necessity to move other Subcommittee and Commission meetings.

By way of this staff report, Staff recommends that the Arts and Cultural Affairs Commission approve the 2026 Regular Meeting Schedule as outlined above.
