MINUTES

1. **CALL TO ORDER:** Chair Eichman called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.
2. **LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT:** Chair Eichman read the Land Acknowledgement.
3. **PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE:** Wendy Goldman, West Hollywood led the Pledge of Allegiance.
4. **ROLL CALL:** Transportation and Mobility Commission Secretary Brandee Thornton took roll call.

PRESENT: Commissioner Scott Korinke, Commissioner Helen M. Krieger, Commissioner Jody Litvak, Commissioner Dan Wentzel, Vice Chair Steven B. Greene, and Chair David M. Eichman

ABSENT: Commissioner Jordan David

ALSO PRESENT: Department of Public Works Director Helen Collins, Transportation and Mobility Manager Tamar Fuhrer, Senior Transportation Planner Chris Corrao, Transportation Planner David Fenn, Principal Traffic Engineer Richard Garland, Assistant Civil Engineer Walter Davis, Long Range Planning Manager Francisco Contreras, and Transportation and Mobility Commission Secretary Brandee Thornton

5. **APPROVAL OF AGENDA**

ACTION: Approve the agenda of November 19, 2025. **Motion by Commissioner Litvak to approve the November 19, 2025 agenda, seconded by Commissioner Krieger and approved with a vote of 6-0.**

6. **APPROVAL OF MINUTES**

ACTION: Approve the amended minutes of October 15, 2025. **Motion by Vice Chair Greene to approve the October 15, 2025 minutes, seconded by Commissioner Wentzel and approved with a vote of 5-0, noting the abstention of Chair Eichman.**

7. **PUBLIC COMMENT:**

WENDY GOLDMAN, WEST HOLLYWOOD requested a traffic calming study for Larrabee Street, an increase to traffic safety measures at the Cynthia and Doheny intersection, and an update on the shuttle route.

KEVIN BURTON, WEST HOLLYWOOD requested an update on the city's action to paint bike lanes green.

8. CONSENT CALENDAR: None.

9. NEW BUSINESS:

A. NEIGHBORHOOD TRAFFIC CALMING AND SAFETY MEASURES:

Assistant Civil Engineer Walter Davis recommended installing speed lumps to enhance safety near the Center for Early Education and noted that additional treatments are pending installation along Rosewood and Sweetzer Avenues.

Action: Following deliberation, a motion was made by Vice Chair Greene to approve staff's recommendation of adding speed lumps to the 500 block of Alfred Street, and the 8468-8442 block of Clinton Avenue. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Litvak and passed with a vote of 6-0.

B. DISCUSSION AND APPROVAL OF TRANSPORTATION AND MOBILITY COMMISSION MEETING SCHEDULE FOR CALENDAR YEAR 2026.

Senior Transportation Planner Chris Corrao reviewed the proposed 2026 Transportation and Mobility Commission meeting schedule.

Action: Following deliberation, a motion was made by Commissioner Litvak to approve the proposed Transportation and Mobility Commission meeting schedule for 2026. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Krieger and passed with a vote of 6-0.

10. UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

A. METRO K LINE EXTENSION UPDATE

Senior Planner David Fenn reported that Metro's route decision is expected in early 2026, with date confirmation anticipated in the coming weeks. The approval will move through Metro's Planning and Programming Committee then the full Metro Board. The City may run special Cityline shuttles to support public participation at these meetings. He added that staff continues outreach to major stakeholders including the Pacific Design Center (PDC), the Grove, and Cedars-Sinai as metro evaluates route options that could bring additional stations to West Hollywood.

B. WEHO TARGET VISION ZERO CRASH DATA DASHBOARD

Senior Planner David Fenn provided an update on the development of the Vision Zero crash data dashboard, noting that staff may transition from a text and chart-based format to a map-based platform and shared examples from other cities to illustrate potential approaches.

KEVIN BURTON, WEST HOLLYWOOD provided public comment in support of development of the Vision Zero crash data dashboard.

Commissioners offered feedback and expressed interest in dashboard filters such as time of day, age, disability status, pedestrian and cyclist involvement, collision severity, and trends. They also expressed a desire to incorporate Sheriff's Department data into the dashboard.

11. ITEMS FROM STAFF:

Director of Public Works, Helen Collins introduced Tamar Fuhrer as the City's new Transportation and Mobility Manager. Director Collins also reported that the city is finalizing a film-friendly color for its new green Class II bike lanes and will proceed with installation once weather allows for a test patch.

Chair Eichman requested an update on the City Manager recruitment, and Director Collins reported that the process is underway with an announcement expected before January.

Mr. Corrao announced Operation Firefly, a bike light giveaway event co-hosted with the Los Angeles Bicycle Coalition. Additionally, Mr. Corrao confirmed that a quorum will be present for the December Transportation and Mobility Commission meeting.

Mr. Fenn informed that the City's Metro Open Streets funding request is progressing with staff recommending approval of a 2026 CicLAvia event and potentially a 2028 San Vicente Olympics fan zone closure. The Metro Board will make its final decision on December 4, 2025.

12. PUBLIC COMMENT: None

13. ITEMS FROM COMMISSIONERS / SUBCOMMITTEE REPORTS:

Commissioners formally welcomed Tamar Fuhrer as the City's new Transportation and Mobility Manager.

Commissioner Litvak highlighted CicLAvia and the Festival Trail Charette, requested a briefing on transportation funding flows, and suggested enhancing traffic control measures around special events. Commissioner Litvak referenced a New York Times article on Iowa City's fare free public transit. Additionally, Commissioner Litvak suggested that any West Hollywood operated transit adjustments associated with the upcoming Purple Line stations should avoid duplicating existing services.

Commissioner Korinke mentioned California's decision to transition funding from e-bike programs to EVs and encouraged attendance at CicLAvia.

Commissioner Krieger raised neighborhood concerns regarding a shortage of e-bikes in comparison to scooters, the discontinuation of The Pickup's Thursday night service and visibility issues at the La Cienega Boulevard and Sunset Boulevard intersection stoplight. Director Collins informed of plans to reposition that stoplight for better visibility. Commissioner Krieger requested that staff explore relocating the big belly

trash bin near the bus stop at Sunset Boulevard and Hammond Street due to visibility issues for bus operators.

Commissioner Krieger provided updates on her attendance at the Social Justice Advisory Board meeting, the WeHo Human Services Fair, a City Council meeting, and a Public Safety Commission meeting, highlighting Mayor Byers's recommendation for a joint study on Safe Streets projects. Additionally, Commissioner Krieger recognized World Day of Remembrance for Victims of Traffic Violence.

Commissioner Wentzel reminded the Commission of the Metro Westside/Central Service Council meeting dates; he thanked Wendy Goldman for her Cynthia Sunset Neighborhood Watch update and requested an update on the Westside Cities Council of Governments (COG).

Senior Planner David Fenn explained that Mayor Byers and Vice Mayor Heilman represent West Hollywood on the COG, which is analyzing transit corridors. The study is progressing from existing conditions to a feasibility analysis of transit improvements.

Commissioner Wentzel also requested a legislative update from Government Affairs Liaison Hernan Molina, a safety update for the midblock crosswalk on Crescent Heights Boulevard between Sunset Boulevard and Fountain Avenue, and an update and review of the city transit services, which Director Collins noted will be addressed through an upcoming RFP.

Vice Chair Greene noted LADOT and Metro are advancing bus lane projects on Sunset Boulevard east of West Hollywood, and that Caltrans is undertaking improvements on Santa Monica Boulevard and between La Brea and the 101 Freeway. The Vice Chair also requested staff investigate the timing of the traffic signal at Fuller Avenue and Santa Monica Boulevard, and to assess the color of the city's decorative globe lights.

Chair Eichman thanked Vice Chair Green for leading the October Transportation and Mobility Commission meeting and Commissioner Krieger for attending the Public Safety Commission meeting. The Chair noted that the Houston City Council banned e-scooter use from 8:00 pm through 4:00 am and suggested that West Hollywood might consider a similar measure to increase safety.
